TAG teams up with the Toronto Waldorf School

Work experience is a term used to describe students' participation in a real-life working environment within the larger context of their on-going education. In many schools it is a well-established and accepted fact of life that education, to be complete, needs to reach out and embrace the world of work.

Waldorf schools internationally have offered the "practicum" as their version of work experience for over 50 years. Rather than detracting from students' academic studies, it has been found to be a positive influence in their lives, reinforcing their in-class experiences with a strong and productive connection to the outer world. The school reports that students look forward to their practica with enthusiasm, and return uplifted, with experiences which carry them, in some cases, for years. Many international exchange students, returning to the Toronto Waldorf School from Waldorf schools in Europe and elsewhere maintain that the practicum was the highlight of their experience abroad.

The Toronto Waldorf School has had a highly successful work experience program since 1992, and we are pleased to have joined their Grade 9 Work Experience Program for 2017. This week we welcomed students Annika and Bianca, who will live, work, and play with us for 3 weeks. We can't wait to teach them about organic farming, and get their perspective on the future of sustainable food production.
